- Only grades of "C" or higher count toward the General Education Program (GEP); Pass/Fail courses will not count.
- No one course may satisfy more than one GEP area; a course may count for C or SS, for instance, but not both.
- Crosslisted courses may be considered as coming from any of their disciplines.

Maximum of 90 Credits from all sources.

- No more than three courses from one discipline may be used to satisfy the GEP, except ENGL, which may have three courses in addition to the English Composition requirement.
- AP, IP, and CLEP exams may fulfill GEP requirements if they have UMBC GEP equivalents; departmental creditby-exam will not fulfill GEP requirements.
- Only one studio or performance course may count toward GEP requirements.
- Only one First-Year Seminar course may count toward GEP requirements.
