It has been great fun to serve as the interim Chair of the History Department this year! A lot is happening at UMBC. The Carnegie Foundation reassessed UMBC's accomplishments and assigned us to a new ranking as a Research 1 University. This rank acknowledges UMBC's impressive track record in research and innovation. I think it's fair to say the History Department continues to make an important contribution to UMBC's success. Our faculty has continued to win prestigious fellowship awards to conduct research that is relevant and important. In addition to the awards highlighted in this newsletter, Dr. Brian Van Wyck won a residential fellowship to join a research group on religion and secularism at the Center for Advanced Studies at the University of Munich, Germany in the summer of 2023. He also won a National Academy of Education, Spencer Postdoctoral Fellowship to



continue his research during the 2023-2024 academic year. Further, our faculty communicate not only in books and articles mostly read by academics, but also in a variety of formats intended to facilitate broader public discussion; Dr. Constantine Vaporis appeared in appeared in the NHK documentary, "Tokugawa Japan Summit 2023" which provided historical background and context for a year-long historical drama about the founder of the Tokugawa dynasty (1603-1868), Tokugawa Ieyasu. Finally, we were also delighted to welcome three new babies to our History Department family this year! Dr. Meredith Oyen's daughter Magdalene, Dr. Brian Van Wyck's daughter Anneka; and history department accounting assistant Keena Garris's son Dallen.



Dr. Terry Bouton's research was cited in the NY Times opinion piece "Manchin is Just a Symptom. It's the Senate that's Sick" by Jamelle Bouie.



During her Fletcher Jones Foundation Fellowship, **Dr. Amy Froide** has been researching and writing a book on financial scandal in 18th-century London. On that topic, she has written an <u>article</u> for The Conversation on the similarities between the FTX collapse and the 18th century Charitable Corporation Scandal, a second <u>article</u> on utilizing recipes to teach history, and had her book, "Never Married: Singlewomen in Early Modern England," placed on a <u>recommended reading list</u> of histories about women and their communities.

Dr. Susan McDonough spent a month in Palermo Italy's Archivio de Stato working with notarial registers for her research on women in the medieval Mediterranean which has so far resulted in the first "stake in the ground" article co-authored with Dr. Michelle Armstrong-Partida (Emory University) that appears in *Past & Present*, an Oxford academic journal.



Filling in as interim Chair of the History Department, **Dr. Denise Meringolo** has also completed her first year of a two-year term as Vice President of the National Council on Public History (NCPH). Her roles include assigning volunteers to NCPH committees and being a member of the governance, development, and executive committees. And even though this role requires a LOT of meetings, she finds it really exciting to contribute to the growth and evolution of the premier professional organization in her field.

While away on a Carnegie fellowship, **Dr. Derek Musgrove** has written an article on D.C. African Liberation Day that can be found <u>here</u>. He also received recognition of his book, "Chocolate City: A History of Race and Democracy in the Nation's Capital," as one of the best historical books about Washington, D.C. Dr. Julie Oakes is excited to announce that after three years of waiting, she is finally taking students — twenty-three of them—to Japan over the summer. Four of the students are History majors: Annie Fowler, Siskind Oshry, Lauren Toole, and Walter Valled. Students are able to participate in the experience as either HIST 392 or ASIA 392 to receive credit as either culture or arts and humanities.

Dr. Scott also presented this topic for the annual Social Science's Low Lecture She was also a guest on "The Songbirds Radio Hour" hosted by the Songbirds Guitar & Pop Culture Museum.


